I understand that to meet the legal requirements and qualify to apply to the Student Election Judge Program, I must:

- Be enrolled as a Junior or Senior in a public or private secondary school in DeKalb County, with a 3.0 GPA or higher
- Be a U.S. citizen at the time of the next election,
- Have written approval from a parent or guardian and the principal of the school,
- Satisfactorily complete an election judge training course, and
- Register to vote if 18 years of age on or before the next General Election.

Additionally, students must:

- Assist other judges and share responsibility for the operation of the voting site,
- Provide a copy of my assignment letter to the appropriate school personnel to receive an excused absence for the day and collect and complete any assignments that are missed (if applicable).

Time Commitment and Compensation:

- 5:15 AM - 8:15 PM or later. All Election Judges must assist with voting site closing/tear-down procedures.
- Compensation: \$110-150 - Must work entire Election Day and attend training to receive full compensation.
